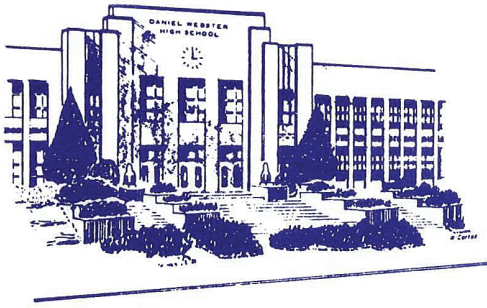

The organ has been a part of Webster's rich tradition, being played at Talicades, class assemblies, graduation, etc. In researching the problem and repair of the organ, we have learned it was and still is a quality instrument very much worth repairing. Our Hammond organ is considered a theatrical organ, well suited to being played in venues such as Webster's auditorium. While this is one of the largest Century Club projects to date, we are confident that it will be as successful as other CC projects. A few past projects have been: stadium lighting, building of student pavilions, restoration of the bridges, and new curtains for the stage. *The organ accompanying the musical acts in Talicade? Perhaps your act?*

*The organ accompanying the mixed chorus for programs?*

*The organ accompanying student solos in assemblies?*

*The sound of the organ playing as you filed into the auditorium in your cap and gown for your senior assembly?*

*Did you play the organ? Or perhaps one of your close friends?*

Well, the years have silenced this musical voice in the auditorium....it's sat silence for the past 10 years. The organ needs to be repaired and the speakers replaced to be useable again. This is our most ambitious Century Club Project to date. Early estimates for the repairs and all of the speakers in the area of \$14,000. To replace the organ with a new similar one but of lessor quality would be in excess of \$45,000 and it would be less suitable, so we have decided to have the organ repaired.
